

Wines from Alto Adige: Complex and Characterised by the Mountains

The wine country of Alto Adige is shaped by contrast – and the mountain ranges of the Alps. More than 20 grape varieties grow in Mediterranean valleys and up to an altitude of 1,000 metres above sea level at the foot of the Dolomites. 4,800 winegrowers make sure that this kind of diversity gets bottled.


